## International Bacc./Adv. Placement



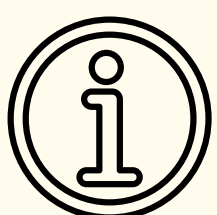
Colleges value them because of their rigor and can help with competitiveness of college admissions. High School courses that are one full year.



Limited amount of courses offered. Limited amount of credits that can be earned.



Required to take a test and pass with a certain score (usually 3 out of 5) to earn the college credit. Don't pass = no credit. Each test is about \$95 (fee may fluctuate).



Although one full year in length, colleges/universities usually only give one semester's worth of credit. International Baccalaureate is often less common than Advanced Placement classes and more rigorous.

## Dual Enrollment



Take college classes that count towards high school requirements as well as credits for college transfer to most universities. Experience a taste of college to truly prepare students for college environment. Students are mentored throughout all of high school and during dual enrollment.



Save thousands, as courses are free to high school students. Graduate college sooner. Start career sooner. College credit guaranteed if classes are passed.



Can potentially complete one or more Associates of Arts (A.A.) Degrees while in high school. Can go into college/university with a good GPA. When General Education classes are completed, students can focus more on their major/passion.
